## LOCATION AND DEMOGRAPHICS

- 39th largest city in the United States
- Largest city in Nebraska
- City population of 486,051
- Metro area population of more than 1 million
- 77% of residents are white, 13% are Black, 13% are Hispanic and 3% are Asian
- 70% of the population is married
- 56% of residents have children under the age of 18



## EDUCATION

- One of the top 10 states in the country for pre-K to 12th grade education
- First in the nation with a 94% high school graduation rate
- Nebraska students score above the national average on tests for math, science and reading proficiency

## CLIMATE

- Spring: highs in the 60s and lows in the 40s
- Summer: highs in the 80s and lows in the mid-60s
- Fall: highs in the 70s and lows in the 50s
- Winter: highs in the 30s and lows in the mid-teens
